

## Survey Results BeHeard Frequency and Topics



### SURVEY FREQUENCY WAS ABOUT RIGHT

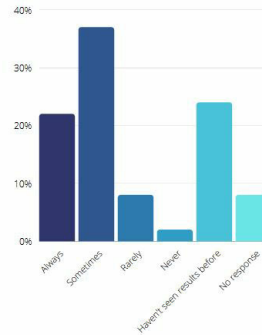


Almost three-quarters of respondents said surveys were going out at just the right frequency (of twice a month). A few of you wanted fewer surveys, and a couple respondents wanted more.

### MOST RESPONDENTS AREN'T READING THE RESULTS

Only 22% of respondents said they always read the survey results when we send them out. A similar percentage said they haven't seen the results.

### RESPONDENTS HAD A WIDE RANGE OF SUGGESTED TOPICS



We asked you what topics you wanted to see in future surveys, and we received a wide range of responses. The most common topics were crime issues and reduction, trash, and city services or agencies, but individual issues ranged from what to do about specific statues in different parts of the city to regional governance by the city and surrounding counties.

**About this survey** - This survey was open for responses from April 7-19, 2021. There were 107 respondents. The demographics of the BeHeard Baltimore™ panel do not match those of the city of Baltimore. This leads to skewed responses that likely do not reflect the views of city residents as a whole. The University of Baltimore, the administrators of the BeHeard project, are working to expand survey participation through media and organizational outreach. Due to concerns about the respondents' demographics, the survey results presented here should only be considered reflective of the survey respondents and not city residents as a whole.
