ACCESS TO QUALITY TRAINING PROGRAMS




7 in 10 respondents also said it is extremely important to expand access to career and technology programs in Baltimore's schools

About this survey - This survey was open for responses from February 16-26, 2021. There were 116 respondents. The demographics of the BeHeard BaltimoreTM panel do not match those of the city of Baltimore. This leads to skewed responses that likely do not reflect the views of city residents as a whole. The University of Baltimore, the administrators of the BeHeard project, are working to expand survey participation through media and organizational outreach. Due to concerns about the respondents' demographics, the survey results presented here should only be considered reflective of the survey respondents and not city residents as a whole.
