


Survey Results COVID-19: One Year Later





RESPONDENTS WHO ARE VACCINATED OR PLAN TO BE

43% of respondents were vaccinated with one or both shots; 9 in 10 those without appointments planned to get vaccinated


Reasons why respondents may not get

- vaccinated:


 Don't trust the vaccine
- Possible side effects
 Not sure it is necessary
- Medically unable to receive the vaccine Not wanting to take resources from more vulnerable populations

PANDEMIC'S EFFECTS ON **EMPLOYMENT**

Most respondents saw some effect on their employment - most common was that they teleworked more frequently. More than 40% of respondents saw no effect on their employment.



CONTINUING CONCERNS ABOUT CATCHING VIRUS, NEW CONCERNS ABOUT GETTING VACCINE



16% of respondents were concerned about catching COVID-19, and another 16% were concerned about vaccine access for themselves or those close to them. Respondents also wanted to see family and friends and were worried about continued isolation or their physical health.

APPROVAL OF MAYOR SCOTT'S **ACTIONS**

Over half of respondents approved of Mayor Scott's actions in response to the pandemic.

About this survey - This survey was open for responses from March 2-15, 2021. There were 146 respondents. The demographics of the BeHeard Baltimore TM panel do not match those of the city of Baltimore. This leads to skewed responses that likely do not reflect the views of city residents as a whole. The University of Baltimore, the administrators of the BeHeard project, are working to $expand \ survey \ participation \ through \ media \ and \ organizational \ outreach. \ Due \ to \ concerns \ about \ the$ respondents' demographics, the survey results presented here should only be considered reflective of the survey respondents and not city residents as a whole.
